Getting started Telephone base and charger installation Install the telephone base and charger(s) as shown below. If you subscribe to digital subscriber line (DSL) high-speed Internet service through your telephone line, you must install a DSL filter between the telephone line cord and the telephone wall jack. Getting started Battery installation Install the battery as shown below. Plug the battery connector securely into the socket inside the handset battery compartment. Place the battery with the label THIS SIDE UP facing up and the wires inside the battery compartment. Align the cover flat against the battery compartment, then slide it towards the center of the handset until it clicks into place. Getting started Battery charging Once you have installed the battery, the screen indicates the battery status (see the table below). If necessary, place the handset in the telephone base or charger to charge the battery. For best performance, keep the handset in the telephone base or charger when not in use. Getting started Installation options The telephone comes ready for tabletop use. If you want to mount your telephone on a wall, use the provided wall mount bracket to connect with a standard dual-stud telephone wall mount plate. If you do not have this wall mount plate, you can purchase one from many hardware or consumer electronics retailers. Page 10 Getting started Installation options (continued) Wall mount to tabletop installation If the telephone line cord and power adapter cord are bundled, untie them first. Slide the black wall mount bracket up and remove it from the wall mount plate. Unplug the end of the telephone line cord (or DSL filter) from the telephone wall jack. Getting started Telephone base layout X/DELETE Press to delete the message currently playing (page 42). When the telephone is not in use, press twice to delete all previously reviewed messages (page 43). IN USE light Flashes when there is an incoming call, or another telephone sharing the same line is in use. Getting started Handset layout CHARGE light On when the handset is charging in the telephone base or charger (page 3). /VOLUME Press to enter the directory when the telephone is not in use (page 27). Press to scroll up while in a menu, or in the directory, call log or redial list. Page 13 Getting started Handset layout MENU/SELECT Press to show the menu. While in a menu, press to select an item, or save an entry or setting. CID /VOLUME Press to review the call log when the telephone is not in use (page 32). Press to scroll down while in a menu, or in the directory, call log or redial list. Telephone settings Using the menu In the ringers menu, you can select the ringer tones and adjust the ringer volume for incoming calls. In the settings menu, you can change and edit the settings for LCD language, voicemail indicators, key tone, date and time, home area code and dial mode. Go to Answering system settings starting on page 35 for instructions on how to modify the answering system settings with a system handset shown in the table below. Telephone settings Ringer volume (handset) You can adjust the ringer volume or turn the ringer off. Press MENU/SELECT Press to select >RINGERS, then press /SELECT. MENU to select >RINGER VOLUME, then press Press /SELECT. MENU Press to adjust the volume. A sample of each ringer volume plays as you scroll through the choices. Telephone settings LCD language You can select a language (English, French or Spanish) to be used in all screen displays. Press MENU/SELECT to select >SETTINGS, then press Press Press to select >LCD LANGUAGE, then press /SELECT. MENU to choose ENGLISH, FRANÇAIS or Press ESPAÑOL. Telephone settings Clear voicemail indicators If you subscribe to voicemail service offered by your telephone service provider, NEW VOICEMAIL and messages. Contact your telephone service provider for more information about using your voicemail service. After you have listened to all new voicemail messages, the indicators on the handset turn off automatically. Telephone settings Set date and time The answering system announces the date and time of each message prior to playing it. If you subscribe to caller ID service, the day, month and time are set automatically with each incoming call. However, the year must be correct so that the day of the week can be calculated from the caller ID information. Telephone settings Home area code If you dial your local calls using only seven digits (area code not required), you can program your home area code so that when you receive a call within your local area, the telephone number is automatically stored without the area code in the call log. Telephone operation Make a call Press , then wait for a dial tone. FLASH -OR- Press to use the speakerphone, then wait for a dial tone. Use the dialing keys to enter the telephone number. Redial a call Use the dialing keys to enter the telephone number (up to 30 digits). • Telephone operation Mute The mute function allows you to hear the other party but the other party cannot hear you. Telephone operation Chain dialing Use this feature to initiate a dialing sequence from numbers stored in the directory, call log or redial while you are on a call. Caller ID Call log If you subscribe to caller ID service, information about each caller will appear after the first or second ring. If you answer a call before the caller information appear on the screen, it will not be saved in the call log. • Caller ID Missed call indicator When there are calls that have not been reviewed, the idle handset shows XX MISSED CALLS. Each time you review a call log entry marked NEW, the number of missed calls decrease by one. When you have reviewed all the missed calls, the missed calls indicator no longer shows. Caller ID View dialing options Although the call log entries received have 10 digits (the area code plus the seven-digit number), in some areas, you may dial only the seven digits, or 1 plus the seven digits, or 1 plus the area code plus the seven digits. You may change the number of digits that you dial from or store in the directory. Caller ID Delete from the call log To delete one entry: When in the call log, press /DELETE to delete the selected entry. The screen displays Press MUTE DELETING... and then you hear a confirmation tone. To delete all entries: Press MENU/SELECT to select >CALL LOG, then press... Answering system settings Answering system setup Use the answering system menu of a system handset to turn on or off the answering system or message alert tone, set up the announcement message, activate the call screening, or change the number of rings, remote access code and message recording time. Answering system settings Record a new announcement Press MENU/SELECT to scroll to >ANSWERING SYS, then press Press /SELECT to choose >ANNOUNCEMENT. The system announces, Press MENU "To play, press 2. To record, press 7." Press 7. The system announces, "Record after the tone. Press 5 when you are done." After the tone, face and speak towards the handset microphone to record your announcement. Answering system settings Call screening You can listen at the telephone base to a caller leaving a message. If you want to turn off the call screening feature, use a system handset to turn this feature off. Press MENU/SELECT to select >ANSWERING SYS, then press Press to select >ANS SYS SETUP, then press... Answering system settings Message alert tone When the message alert tone is turned on and you have new message(s), the telephone base beeps every 10 seconds. Unless you change it, the message alert tone is set to off. Press MENU/SELECT to select >ANSWERING SYS, then press Press... Answering system operation Answering system and voicemail indicators Your telephone has separate indicators for two different types of voice messages: those left on its built-in answering system and those left at your service provider's (fees may apply). Your telephone's built-in answering system messages and voicemail messages are separate. Answering system operation Voice prompts The system provides voice prompts to guide you through recording announcement and remote access messages. Message capacity The answering system can record up to 99 messages, depending on the length of each message. Individual messages can be up to three minutes see page 38 to change the length. Answering system operation Call screening at the handset If the answering system is on, the announcement and the incoming message broadcast at the telephone base when a call is answered by the answering system.
